
The service for the Reformation Festival was held by Prof. Dr. Heinrich Bedford-Strohm. As Chairman of the Council of the EKD, it was his last service, as his term of office ends in the next few days, and it was an honor for him to celebrate this service in the Schlosskirche.

Following the service, a digital reconstruction of the Schlosskirche was opened, which visitors will now be able to explore via smartphone or from a computer. When was the last time you were in Wittenberg? Why not look at the digital Schlosskirche right now? See https://www.schlosskirche-wittenberg.de/vr/. As a special highlight, visitors can virtually enter the castle church not only in its current appearance but also in the state it was in 1517 and view Luther's original theses door. In addition, a great deal of multimedia background information can be accessed.



The elaborate computer animation of the late Gothic castle church was created based on extensive scientific research by the Dresden-based company specializing in the visualization of historical buildings, although the once extensive furnishings were only depicted in outline due to many gaps in the tradition. It is a great experience to virtually follow in Luther's footsteps into the Wittenberg Castle Church of 1517 and thus experience Reformation history more vividly.

Strengthened and blessed, we then return to our seats. The congregation has become accustomed to this new form. Despite the distance, one feels the connection to the other parishioners as in the "classic" form.



Members of the congregation brought harvest gifts from their gardens to this year's harvest service and, together with sexton Mr. Jörg Preller, decorated the altar area. It was a special honor for me to celebrate this service with guests and parishioners and to experience how lovingly the church was decorated.
